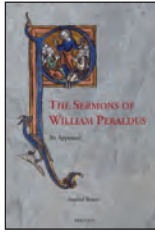

The French Dominican William Peraldus produced several cycles of sermons. This study analyzes them in some detail and argues that, rather than collecting sermons he had preached earlier, Peraldus wrote these sermons systematically for the use of other preachers. The sermons are presented in their original Latin text together with an English translation in order to demonstrate how Peraldus dealt with the biblical text as well as his moral concerns and his literary style.

This study analyzes in detail the *Novum opus dominicale* of John Waldeby, a member of the convent of the Augustinian friars in York. A detailed investigation of a single mendicant sermon collection: how, where, why, and for whom it was composed and how it was designed to be used. By setting this collection in its specific context, the study sheds new light on the whole system of preaching support which made the mendicant orders such effective communicators in the later Middle Ages.

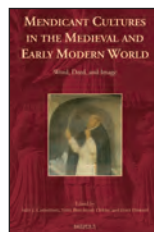

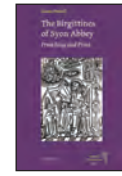


Peter Lombard and His Students

This was particularly important during the controversy over his Christological teachings.
