

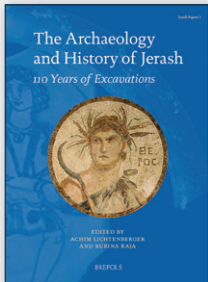

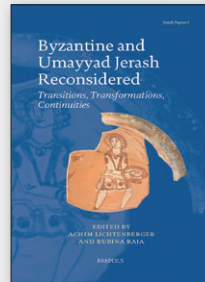


The Archaeology and History of Jerash 110 Years of Excavations

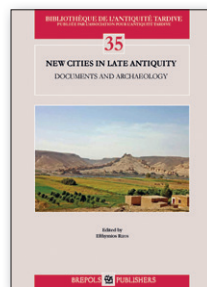


Burial assemblages from Bab el-Gasus in the Geographical Society of Lisbon
