





### THE SYNOD OF DORDRECHT 1618/1619

The Synod of Dordrecht (or Dordt) and its decisions have been critical for the developments of international Calvinism, not least because it represented the first and, to the present, only international Reformed Synod. The acceptance of the *Canons of Dordrecht* meant an end to decades of inner-Reformed discussions on the relation between God's sovereignty and human responsibility. In Dordrecht, the Reformed doctrine on this central issue was defined as the sole way of dealing with it according to Scripture. This also meant that Dordrecht became the unifying force for generations of Calvinist Reformed churches around the world which accepted the *Canons* as their confessional basis and norm. The confessional status is similar to that of the Lutheran *Book of Concord*, implying that for the coming centuries one's position on Dordrecht was essential for being Reformed. Although the main focus of the Synod was on the dispute on predestination, decisions made on other topics were also very important and influential. Dordrecht was significant also in regard to Church polity. With the acceptance of the so-called Dordrecht Church order (*Dordtse kerkorde*), the responsibilities of Church and state were clarified and the Church order of Dordrecht remained for centuries the rule for Church polity in Reformed churches in the Netherlands. Of further lasting importance was the decision on a new Bible translation, which was published in 1637 as the *Statevertaling*, a translation that not only shaped Reformed spirituality for centuries, but also had a large impact on the development of the Dutch language.

### HISTORICAL BACKGROUND


The Synod of Dordrecht and its main doctrinal document, known as the *Canons of Dordrecht*, resulted on the one hand from an international dispute over the relationship between divine sovereignty and human responsibility which lasted more than half a century, and on the other hand from growing political and theological tensions in the Netherlands.

The international dispute goes back to the debate between Luther and Erasmus over the freedom of the will, to Augustine's battles with Pelagius, and even to the Bible itself in the discussion in Rom. 9-11 about the election of





The series *Conciliorum Oecumenicorum Generaliumque Decreta* is intended to offer a better critical edition for the decrees of

- Councils and synods recognised as ecumenical by one or more Churches,
- general Councils of the Churches of one or more traditions,
- Councils which have a greater importance in the history of the Churches themselves.



Canonical reception, theological effect, the scholarly consensus, are therefore applied as the main criteria of a work based on scientific parameters and on philological principles: however, as well as each scholar who needs definitive editions, also the theologian can trace the proper approach of his discipline and confession.

When finished, the series will span almost two millennia of conciliar decrees, all of them critically edited, indexed and introduced by specialists. This unprecedented research program is conducted under the direction of Giuseppe Alberigo i.m. and Alberto Melloni, its results being published as a subseries in the renowned source collection *Corpus Christianorum*.
