





International Bibliography of Humanism and the Renaissance (IBHR)

The *International Bibliography of Humanism and the Renaissance* (IBHR) is the international reference bibliography of academic publications on the Renaissance and the early modern period.

The IBHR is a continuation of the *Bibliographie internationale de l'Humanisme et de la Renaissance*, coordinated and published by Librairie Droz since 1965. Brepols acquired the rights to the Bibliography in 2013 and has since been working on updating the content, extending the coverage, and building new software to support the online edition of the Bibliography.

The IBHR is fully integrated with the *International Medieval Bibliography* and the *Bibliographie de civilisation médiévale*. Together, they make up the cluster *Brepols Medieval and Early Modern Bibliographies*.

Bibliographie Annuelle du Moyen Âge Tardif (BAMAT)

This database, published in collaboration with the IRHT, will be an answer to the challenge raised by the proliferation of the current bibliography, by focusing on two criteria: the speed of the data extraction and the analytical quality of the records.

The database provides an up-to-date bibliography with very little timelag. It is a bibliography about late medieval authors and texts, and includes the manuscripts cited in catalogues by library collections, by genres, or by authors as well as in editions or other studies.
